Senior Warden's Report

I am writing to you on Holy Saturday, holding fast to the wonderful words the Rev. John Pitzer shared in today's reflection. This is the night that Jesus passes from darkness to light. And we are Resurrection People. I know this, and believe we will as a community, a region, a world, weather this storm and come into the light. But while I know this, I do not always feel it. The support of Trinity, our amazing priests and staff and parishioners is helping me to feel it. Thank you.

Much was accomplished this past year. We crafted a new mission statement and strategic plan to guide our efforts. These were based on input from you, our members, and selected stakeholders. The plan is built on our core practices: Worship, Formation and Service. Solid progress has been made on many of the goals we set: (Click here to view Trinity's Strategic Plan).

- Trinity communications were refreshed and modernized. Through the tireless efforts of Ashley Eastham our beautiful new web site was launched. This new platform has been invaluable in the current crisis, enabling interaction and ongoing communication that would not have previously been possible.
- Grants from the Vincent Memorial Legacy were awarded and Trinity Loaves and Fishes continued its feeding ministry. A Mission Commission was formed to better coordinate the many ways Trinity serves our neighbors.
- The care and support extended to members of our congregation by our pastoral care team under the leadership of Maria Elliott make visible and real the commitment of our community to service. This has been even more in evidence since the early days of the COVID-19 outbreak in New Orleans. Melissa Dovie and the Women of Trinity Church have worked without ceasing to bring help where it is needed.
- The Vestry commissioned an Anti-Racism Task Force to assess our efforts over the past 20+ years and to recommend a path forward. The Task Force outlined a Training and Programming Plan. Our commitment to and work towards becoming an anti-racist church will continue to be inspired by the example and teaching of the Rev. Canon William Barnwell.
- The Invite, Welcome, Connect ministry program has been structured with captains and teams assigned. Training and implementation will continue when we are able to again gather.
- We continue to deepen and broaden our "birth to college" formation opportunities. Godly Play participation was strong before the pandemic and

Ashley Bond's creative remote programs have been so meaningful and appreciated.

- Formation opportunities for adults have grown, including the well planned and attended First Sundays, Co-Ed bible study and clergy led book club. The Mourners' Path has been offered twice, bringing comfort and solace to many.
- We completed a Campus Master Plan that includes recommendations for staff offices, space for formation and meetings, and accomodation for outreach programs like Trinity Loaves and Fishes and Rummage. We are planning a capital campaign to fund the highest priority projects, to be kicked off when the time is appropriate.
- Our financial position remains strong. Through the leadership of our stewardship co-chairs Kelly Duncan, Sweet Dupuy and Will French, the skillful efforts of Raina O'Neal and your generosity, pledges received are at an all time high of \$1,532,461.

The Rev. Kit and Bill McLean have been a vital part of our parish life for five years, each offering wonderful gifts in addition to love and friendship. We are a better community for their having been a part of it. We will miss them and continue to hold them in our hearts and prayers as they discern what God has next in his plan for them.

I will complete my two year term as senior warden in May. It has been a privilege and honor to serve Trinity in this capacity. Cres Gardner will become senior warden and Will French will assume the responsibilities of junior warden. With their capable, committed leadership, guidance from our inspiring clergy and your continued support, I know that our community will continue to flourish.

Trinity Episcopal Church – 2020 Annual Meeting Financial Report

Summary: We continue our efforts to live within our means and fund our operations in a sustainable way. The current economic situation in 2020 puts that at higher risk than we would have anticipated, but we believe that the Trinity community will continue to support the Church in a way that enables our operations to continue as planned.

2019 Summary

- Revenue totaled \$2.86, roughly \$95K lower than budgeted, driven by lower than expected stewardship revenue in December. Historically, Trinity receives 15-20% of its annual stewardship revenue in December, and so any negative variance to this forecast does not allow time to manage expenses downward prior to year-end.
- The management team was able to proactively manage other expenses throughout the year to come in on budget, resulting in an operating deficit of that same \$95K. This deficit was further reduced by a \$22K transfer from the Buildings and Grounds Reserve, resulting in a final net deficit for the year of \$73K. Although this was not where we all wanted to be at year end, this still represents only 2% of budget, which ultimately is not a surprising outcome given the reliance on December revenue to meet our annual goals.

2020 Budget

Since adopting the Financial Guiding Principles some years ago, Trinity has sought to not only live within its means throughout the year, but to make up any deficit that is recorded at year end by incorporating that into the subsequent year's budget. Impressively, the management team was able to propose a balanced budget that incorporates the operating needs to maintain our mission as well as absorb the \$73K deficit recorded in 2019.

Current Outlook for 2020

- Prior to the stay-at-home order issued one month ago, Trinity was roughly on pace to meet budget goals for both revenue and expense. In the first weeks after the order, revenue has dropped markedly, but not in any way that will immediately necessitate changes in our programming, or in the commitment to our staff.
- Both Trinity School and Trinity Church are eligible for the Payroll Protection Program (PPP), and have successfully participated in that program. The net loan amount received by the Church is \$274K, which is eligible for loan forgiveness if we deploy that toward approved expenses, as we intend to do.
- While expenses can be managed, the revenue picture for Trinity Church is less certain. Because of our success in participating in the PPP, our budget can absorb a longer-term reduction in stewardship revenue, similar to the level seen in the first weeks of the stay at home order. If, however, reductions continue for a longer period, or if the level of stewardship revenue declines at a higher rate, additional expense controls by management would need to be considered.

In this time of uncertainty, we all look to our faith and to each other to help carry us through. We are grateful for our health and we try as best we can to support those who are suffering or who have lost loved ones. Now more than ever, we recognize our Trinity community as a pillar that we can count on in difficult times, and we ask that you maintain and if possible, increase your financial support so that our operations can continue and the work of our amazing team is not put at risk.

As always, the finance committee thanks you for your generosity and your support.
