Prelude

Welcome

Opening Prayer

Presider Light and peace to you, in Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Your Word, O God, is a lamp unto my feet.

All And a light unto my path.

Presider For now we see in a mirror dimly, but then we will see face to face. Now I know

only in part; then I will know fully, even as I have been fully known. And now

faith, hope and love abide, these three:

All And the greatest of these is love. (1 Corinthians 13:12-13)

Presider Let us light a candle in, with and for love.

All May we dwell in the light of Christ's love.

Presider God be with you.

People And also with you.

Presider Let us pray.

Lord, it is night. The night is for stillness. Let us be still in the presence of God. It is night after a long day. What has been done has been done; what has not been done has not been done. Let it be. The night is dark. Let our fears of the darkness of the world and of our own lives rest in you. The night is quiet. Let the quietness of your peace enfold us, all dear to us, and all who have no peace. The night heralds the dawn. Let us look expectantly to a new day, new joys, new possibilities. In your name we pray. Amen. (New Zealand Prayer Book)

Presider Lighten our darkness, we beseech you, O God. As you look upon us this evening,

may the light of your countenance pass beyond our sins, even to the depths of our hearts; and bring to birth there increased faith, new hope and a deep and trustful

Presider As far as the heavens are high above the earth,

so great is your loving response to those who are humble;

so far does your enduring strength

uphold those who face the darkness within. As parents are concerned for their children,

so you come to those who reach out in faith, hope and love.—Psalm 103:11-13

Leader Eternal God, you came that we might have life, and might have it more abundantly.

Grant your healing grace to all who are sick with the coronavirus and other illnesses, that they may be made whole in body, mind and spirit. We pray for the elderly, the anxious and the lonely among us: that they may receive comfort,

companionship and care from those around them.

All For with you is the well of life, and in your light, we see light.

Leader Creator God, source of health and salvation, grant to all who minister to the

suffering wisdom and skill, sympathy and patience. Guide and protect all

healthcare personnel, caregivers and government officials as they work to contain and cure the coronavirus, both now and for the future. May their hands be your hands, O Christ, hands of compassion and healing, hands of hope and peace.

All For with you is the well of life, and in your light, we see light.

Leader Gracious God, we pray for those who are under stay-at-home orders and those who

work outside the home in essential capacities. We pray that when we are tired and discouraged, we may find strength in the signs of a loving and faithful God in those

around us, and the joy of the Holy Spirit within us.

All For with you is the well of life, and in your light, we see light.

Leader God of peace, restore whatever lies broken by our rejection of you in our lives, in

our nation, and in the world. Keep us from being content with things as they are, that from your central peace there may come creative compassion and the

willingness to serve a wounded, broken world.

All For with you is the well of life, and in your light, we see light.

Leader Holy Spirit, our Advocate and Comforter, sustain and support the fearful and lift up all who are brought low. Mend broken relationships, and restore those in

distress to soundness of mind, hopefulness of heart, and serenity of spirit.

All For with you is the well of life, and in your light, we see light.

Leader We pray for your church throughout the world and for our Trinity family, especially (pause so that names may be added either silently or aloud)... We pray for

people of all faiths and those of none. We pray also for those who have no one to

pray for them and those whose needs are known to you alone.

All For with you is the well of life, and in your light, we see light.

Leader God of mercy and loving-kindness, grant to the dying peace and a holy death.

Comfort and uphold those who mourn, that they may know the consolation of your love. Let light perpetual shine upon those we love but see no longer. We pray

especially for (pause so that names may be added either silently or aloud)...

All For with you is the well of life, and in your light, we see light.

Presider God of light and life, shine within our darkness that we may see the glory of your

Son Jesus Christ revealed.

All Lord Jesus Christ, you give yourself for us and to us that you may be known

through us; now we give ourselves to you and for you that the light of your love may shine in us and through us into the world. Amen.

The Lord's Prayer

Presider Together we pray,

All Our Father,

who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done;

on earth as it is in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses,

as we forgive those who trespass against us.

And lead us not into temptation,

but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

The Blessing and Dismissal

Presider God of light and dark, God of stillness and dancing, God of faith, hope and love:

from you comes every blessing and all peace: grant us grace to take up our crosses and follow your Son faithfully ever deeper into your heart which is our true home. And may the blessing of the One who is Love be upon you and those you love now

and forevermore. Amen.
